~Gambling is not Biblical~

Quotes:

- ❖ Saint Augustine said, "The devil invented gambling."
- ❖ John Calvin outlawed gambling in the entire city of Geneva.
- ❖ Martin Luther said, "Money won by gambling is not won without self-seeking and sin."

I have seven statements that show that gambling is not biblical. Let us get into them below.

1. Gambling denies the reality of God as Sovereign.

Scripture clearly and repeatedly teaches that God is the sovereign of the universe, and that as the sovereign of the universe, He both miraculously,  that's by suspending natural law, and providentially, that's by operating through natural law, controls every detail of the outworking of the events in this universe to achieve His own purposes. He is sovereign and He is in control of everything and I do include everything. God is what holds this universe together.

The LORD has established His throne in the heavens, And His sovereignty rules over all. (Psalms 103:19 NASB) He has His throne in heaven where He rules over all.

God even determines how much of an inheritance every person gets. Look at Psalms 47:4; *He chooses our inheritance for us, The glory of Jacob whom He loves. Selah. (Psalms 47:4 NASB)*

It is even God that gives us the power to get wealth as we read in Deuteronomy; *But thou shalt remember the LORD thy God: for it is he that giveth thee power to get wealth, that he may establish his covenant which he sware unto thy fathers, as it is this day. (Deuteronomy 8:18 KJV)*

A couple of verses in Daniel tell us that God lifts up rulers and put down rulers. *"This sentence is by the decree of the angelic watchers And the decision is a command of the holy ones, In order that the living may know*



That the Most High is ruler over the realm of mankind, And bestows it on whom He wishes And sets over it the lowliest of men." (Daniel 4:17 NASB)

that you be driven away from mankind and your dwelling place be with the beasts of the field, and you be given grass to eat like cattle and be drenched with the dew of heaven; and seven periods of time will pass over you, until you recognize that the Most High is ruler over the realm of mankind and bestows it on whomever He wishes. (Daniel 4:25 NASB)

“God is sovereign as He tells us in His Word.”

To believe in luck is to believe that God doesn't exist or that God is not sovereign. If God does exist, and he does, and since He is all-powerful, all-



knowing; He is the creator and sustainer of the universe; He is the One who upholds everything by His own power and brings to pass His own will, there is no such thing as luck- it is non-

existent and chance is non-existent. Things just don't happen randomly by chance. Chance is nothing, it is non-existent. If you understand that, there is no such thing as luck or chance; then why would you gamble? Just remember we can all win with God and “Eternal Life.” You do not have to be a loser!

2. Gambling is not good stewardship of what God has given us.

David put it very well in Psalms 24:1; *The earth is the LORD'S, and all it contains, The world, and those who dwell in it.* (Psalms 24:1



NASB) If the Lord owns it all, then we are just stewards of His universe? This is the bottom line and to gamble is not

stewardship at all. Everything belongs to Him, not us; we own nothing. We have come into this world naked and we will leave that way.

The Lord goes on to tells us that; *"For every beast of the forest is Mine,*



The cattle on a thousand hills."I know every bird of the mountains, And everything that moves in the field is Mine.

"If I were hungry I would not tell you, For the world is Mine, and all it contains. (Psalms 50:10-12 NASB) Everything is His, He owns it all.

It is all His and we have to use our resources He gives us to bring Him glory, and not glory to us. *Whether, then, you eat or drink or whatever you do, do all to the glory of God.* (1 Corinthians 10:31 NASB)

Paul tells us in I Corinthians 4:2 we are to be faithful; *Moreover it is required in stewards, that a man be found faithful.* (1 Corinthians 4:2 KJV)

3. Gambling demeans the God-given place of work.

Have you ever heard of the old saying, "Idle hands are the devil's playthings," well folks, it's true. God didn't give us work because it was good



for Him; He gave us work because it is good for us. Fallen people need to be preoccupied with something other than temptation. God has designed work as a blessing. I know some of you may not think that, but just be out of work with nothing

to do and see how you feel. God laid it out way back in Genesis 3:19;

By the sweat of your face you will eat bread, Till you return to the ground, Because from it you were taken; For you are dust, And to dust you shall return. " (Genesis 3:19 NASB) Folks, we are to work for what we have.

It's to your benefit to work and the book of Proverbs has a lot to say about working and earning your bread and one of the verses that ties in work and gambling is Proverbs 12:11; *He that tilleth his land shall have plenty of bread; But he that followeth after vain persons is void of understanding.* (Proverbs 12:11 ASV) There is no better example of chasing vain persons or fantasies, as some Bible translations say, than gambling. It causes them to disdain work and throw away their money.

4. Gambling is driven by the sin of covetousness and materialism.

Jesus warns us in Luke 12:15; *Then He said to them, "Beware, and be on your guard against every form of greed; for not even when one has an abundance does his life consist of his possessions."* (Luke 12:15 NASB) Are our possessions and greed more important than our abundant life with Christ?



Gambling violates the tenth commandment, which is not to covet, as recorded in Exodus 20:17 and Deuteronomy 5:21. We started out with this commandment at the top of this message. Gambling exist because the sin of greed feeds covetousness and it betrays discontent with God's provision. Greed,

materialism, a love of money, they all flourish in a gambling environment. Gambling, which is built on covetousness is an act of unfaithfulness to God. It assumes that God has not given us what we ought to have. We assume more is better, but is it? Has God not given you enough?

Listen to what it says in Proverbs 30:7-8; *Two things I asked of You, Do not refuse me before I die: Keep deception and lies far from me, Give me neither poverty nor riches; Feed me with the food that is my portion,* (Proverbs 30:7-8 NASB) The writer is saying, “keep deception and lies far from me;” For I want the Truth, the whole Truth and nothing but the Truth.



In the other part he says, “Give me neither poverty nor riches,” so if I have riches, I may deny Him and say; who is the Lord? I don’t need Him! Or if on the other hand I’m poor I may steal.

The last part of verse 8 says: “Feed me with the food that is my portion.” Yes, God knows what each of us need. He will give us no more or less – give me just what I need Lord you must say and be content in Him.

5. Gambling seeks gain from the loss of others.

"You shall not steal. (Exodus 20:15 NASB) The eighth commandment you are breaking when you gamble. It may seem odd to you, but the winner in gambling is stealing from the losers, unknowing who they may be. Gambling is pursuing prosperity at another’s expense, exploiting the poor and the undisciplined. It fundamentally is a violation of the command to “love your neighbor.” Gambling teaches greed and covetousness, and attacks the ethics of hard work. It also has a way of on-demand gratification; instead of seeking God for our needs in His timing, not ours.

Gambling is seductive. It lures people in, and Paul said in I Corinthians 6:12; *All things are lawful unto me, but all things are not expedient: all things are lawful for me, but I will not be brought under the power of any.* (1 Corinthians 6:12 KJV) Paul was saying that he will not become addictive to anything; of course to Christ he was addictive. When you play that first hand

of poker or pull that handle on some slot machine you may very well become addictive to gambling, because it is seductive and a luring effect for the game of chance and luck.

For anyone to support gambling, including the United States government is a travesty on moral and social responsibility. What will the government be into next; selling illegal drugs. Anything for the tax dollar!

6. Gambling breaks the laws of God.

Gambling breaks the laws of God and is wrong from a biblical perspective. There is not one verse that has the word gambling in it, but the



whole thrust of the Bible's teaching is against gambling. Three of the Ten Commandments have a bearing on the issue of gambling, Exodus 20:3, 15, 17. – 1st – 8th – 10th

"You shall have no other gods before Me. (Exodus 20:3 NASB)

As any other sin you can make gambling an addiction and a god. Anything you have that separate you from God will make that sin your god, for our Creator God is a jealous God. Remember He is the one and only Holy God.

"You shall not steal. (Exodus 20:15 NASB) We are stealing by consent. The other gamblers will know that they may lose their possessions.

"You shall not covet your neighbor's house; you shall not covet your neighbor's wife or his male servant or his female servant or his ox or his donkey or anything that belongs to your neighbor." (Exodus



20:17 NASB)

We are coveting or taking possessions from our neighbor and giving them nothing in return.

Proverbs warn against the greed related to gambling.

Proverbs 13:11, 15:27.

Wealth obtained by fraud dwindles, But the one who gathers by labor increases it. (Proverbs 13:11 NASB)

He that is greedy of gain troubleth his own house; but he that hateth gifts shall live. (Proverbs 15:27 KJV)

Gambling also does damage by violating the principle of love. Roman 13:8.



Owe no man any thing, but to love one another: for he that loveth another hath fulfilled the law. (Romans 13:8 KJV)

“Love meets needs, but gambling exploits: love entreats, but gambling mistreats; love strengthens, but gambling weakens; love builds up, but gambling tears down; love never fails, but gambling ever fails.” We could go on and on with Scriptures; there are many.

7. Gambling is addictive.

All things are lawful unto me, but all things are not expedient: all things are lawful for me, but I will not be brought under the power of any.

(1 Corinthians 6:12 KJV)

Expedient defined: “useful, proper, and profitable.” You are not to partake in anything that can be addicting. Seek God and His advice in all matters.

promising them freedom while they themselves are slaves of corruption; for by what a man is overcome, by this he is enslaved. (2 Peter 2:19 NASB)

Here Peter tells us that a man is overcome by what enslaves him. We are only to be slaves to Jesus, not gambling, not any worldly thing.



I read about many people and you probably have also, that are good people, but they turn into thieves all because of the uncontrollable urge to gamble. One such account that I recently read about is below:

A former Goodrich, Michigan tax preparer faces 11 felony charges after police said he swindled more than \$1 million from senior citizens, then gambled it away. John Benjamin III, age 30, is facing up to 20 years in prison. He told retirees he would invest in real estate and promised high returns. Instead he took the money to casinos in Detroit and lost it all.

~What can we do~

1. We are to separate ourselves from the unholy.

"Therefore, COME OUT FROM THEIR MIDST AND BE SEPARATE," says the Lord. "AND DO NOT TOUCH WHAT IS UNCLEAN; And I will welcome you. (2 Corinthians 6:17 NASB)



but like the Holy One who called you, be holy yourselves also in all your behavior; because it is written, "YOU SHALL BE HOLY, FOR I AM HOLY."

(1 Peter 1:15-16 NASB)

We are called to be what? - "Holy" and to be imitators of Jesus Christ!

2. Everything you do is to be done to the Glory of God.

Whether, then, you eat or drink or whatever you do, do all to the glory of God. (1 Corinthians 10:31 NASB)

Paul has good advice for us all; just think before acting and ask the question, "is it to the glory of God or is it for our own glory?" It's a simple question!

~What can one person do? ~

- 1- Determine now that, if you have never gambled, you will never start.
- 2- Determine now that, if you have started gambling, you will do whatever it takes to stop.
- 3- If you have started gambling, pray and seek God for guidance so you can stop, God's way.
- 4- Pray for anyone among your family or friends who is gambling – to whatever degree.

~God Given Wealth~


~They Crucified Him~

Therefore consider the members of your earthly body as dead to immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire, and greed, which amounts to idolatry.


(Colossians 3:5 NASB)
